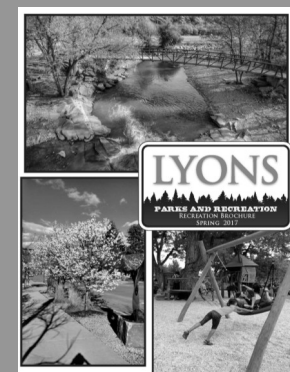

Lyons Community Garage Sale and Town Clean Up Day

The Sustainable Futures Commission (SFC) will be hosting the third annual Lyons' Community Garage Sale Saturday, May 6, from 9am –1pm. The main hub of the Community Garage Sale will be at Sandstone Park where multiple residents will host a flea market style event—you will also be able to get a map at Sandstone Park of all the other homes hosting sales across town. Make sure to take advantage of this reuse opportunity before your next shopping trip! Sunday, May 7, the annual Town cleanup will take place from 9 am to 1 pm at the Wastewater Treatment Plant on 2nd Ave. Bring items for reuse, chipping, composting, and disposal. New Permanent Exhibit

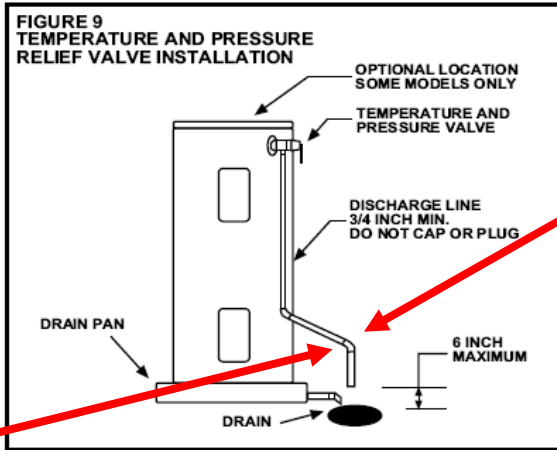
Reception: Saturday, May 13th, 5:30-7:30pm.

In its 126-year history, Lyons has rarely been without at least one newspaper. Chronicling that history, front pages of first editions of newspapers from local collections, including the 1890 *Longs Peak Rustler*. Changing on a weekly basis, visitors can read the news and see what was advertised 115 years ago as reported in early 1900s Lyons Records. Visitors can also “put themselves in the news” and take home a souvenir of their visit through the interactive newspaper photo booth.

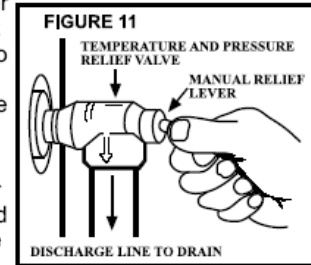

To Drain!

Manually operate the temperature and pressure relief valve at least once a year to make sure it is working properly. To prevent water damage, the valve must be properly connected to a discharge line which terminates at an adequate drain.

Standing clear of the outlet (discharged water may be hot), slowly lift and release the lever handle on the temperature and pressure relief valve to allow the valve to operate freely and return to its closed position. If the valve fails to completely reset and continues to release water, immediately shut-off the electrical power and the cold water inlet valve and call a qualified service technician.



The Town of Lyons Public Works Department, in conjunction with the Lyons Fire Protection District, will be flushing the town's water system throughout the months of May and June. **This will cause** pressure fluctuation in the waterlines throughout town. In the past, some homeowners, and businesses have **experienced damage to their property** because their water heater was not installed properly.

The Pressure Relief Valve on your water heater must be plumbed to a drain capable of handling the volume of water if the valve activates!!!!

Please take a moment to inspect your water heater to make sure the pressure relief valve has a pipe or hose draining into a floor drain. (Please see diagram above.) The Town of Lyons will not be liable for any damages caused to your property because of this issue.

Thank you for your cooperation with checking your water heater prior to the town-wide flushing of the water system.
