
CHRISTMAS TREE RECYCLE

RUN FOR OFFICE

The April 7, 2020 election ballot will ask voters to consider candidates for six Trustee positions and one Mayor. A minimum of ten signatures from registered voters residing within the Town limits is required to establish candidacy. Completed petitions are due back on January 27.

WATER & WASTEWATER

At the November 18, 2019 Board of Trustees meeting, the Board approved two ordinances to increase the service rates for the water and wastewater utility services. Town of Lyons customers' wastewater rates will increase by a monthly increment of \$4.00 per 1,000 gallons. Water service rates will increase \$1.00 per 1,000 gallons.
