TOWN HALL OPENING

Gradual Re-Opening to the Public

Beginning June 1, Town Hall will begin a gradual reopening of certain facilities and in-person services. Members of the public will be allowed access to Town Hall reception and other services, Monday through Thursdays. Only one person at a time may be in the reception area, and the door will continue to be locked; visitors are to use the doorbell system to request entry to Town Hall. The public must make appointments to meet any Town staff other than reception; drop-ins will not be permitted. Town Staff will meet the scheduled appointments outside.



RECOVERY & CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

Milling & Paving

Crews continue to work on paving, curb, and gutter, as part of the flood recovery project along Evans St., 3rd Ave., 4th Ave., 2nd Ave., and McConnell. Over the next few weeks, they will install a new waterline on 3rd Ave.; add curb and gutter along Evans; and mill and replace asphalt. For weekly updates on this project, visit townoflyons.com/pave.

The one-room 1881 Schoolhouse was among the first major structures built with local sandstone under the direction of Edward S. Lyon and by community effort in the newly 1881 platted town of Lyons. Many remodels took place over the years. In 1977 the Lyons Historical Society established a 3-way lease between the St. Vrain Valley School District and the Town of Lyons to preserve this valuable example of Lyons' history for generations to come. The former school building now houses the Lyons Redstone Museum.
