FLOOD-MAPPING MEETING

Monday, Feb. 10, 5:30 to 7:00 p.m.
Lyons Regional Library

Following the 2013 flood, the state-funded Colorado Hazard Mapping Program (CHAMP) has been re-mapping the regulatory floodplain of the most affected waterways in Colorado. In 2019, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) released Preliminary Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) for CHAMP-studied streams, will become FEMA's final effective FIRMs in 2021, pending any appeals received by FEMA.

The Town of Lyons will be hosting a meeting at to review the FEMA appeals process and flood insurance requirements related to the Preliminary FIRMs. Representatives from FEMA will attend and members from the CHAMP team and the county have been invited. All residents and property owners are welcome at this meeting; however, the meeting will focus primarily on properties that may most be affected.
