FREE COVID-19 TESTING IN LYONS

Every Friday through the end of the year, 1:30 - 3 p.m.

Boulder County Public Health, in partnership with Boulder Community Health, diagnostic testing developer Biodesix, Inc., and the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment will begin providing free COVID testing in Lyons.

No appointment is needed, and individuals do not need to have COVID-19 symptoms to be tested. Individuals who are 65 years old or older or are essential workers are encouraged to attend.

Where: Parking lot of Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints, 200 2nd Ave., Lyons
When: 1:30 – 3 p.m. every Friday beginning Oct. 30 through the end of the year, weather permitting and excluding holidays.

Requirement: Mask must be worn

SHERIFF'S OFFICE REMINDERS

Streets, Schools, and Golf Carts

Our local officers and Town officials remind residents about the rules regarding speeding, parking, and licensed golf carts. Now that school is *OFFICIALLY* back in session, it's a good reminder for everyone to practice safe driving.

Lyons Middle/Senior High School

The parking lot is under construction and there is very limited parking for students and for staff near the school. The school requests your help by NOT parking at the school to go to the dog park or biking/hiking access to Picture Rock Trail during school hours, Monday - Friday.

Please remember to always come to a complete stop at a stop sign. Staff and students are walking to and from the school during school hours. There are 3 crosswalks by the school for pedestrian safety. As a reminder, bicyclists and golf carts must also follow vehicular traffic rules.

The speed along McConnell and near the school is 20 MPH. Remember, *twenty is plenty!*

Lyons Elementary School

Please slow down and drive safely around the elementary school. Speed is 15 MPH when school is in session.

Golf Carts

- Drivers must have a valid driver's license to operate a golf cart in the town of Lyons.
- If the driver has a permit, they must have a valid licensed driver with them.
- Also per code, no golf carts may be operated on any state highway within the Town limits, except to cross a state highway at a designated street intersection ie: 4th Ave and Broadway, golf cart must stay on 4th Ave.
- Any person age 18 or younger must be secured by a seat belt at all times while operating or riding in a golf cart on Town streets or rights-of-way.

Parking Reminders

Parking is not allowed:

- on any bridge
- within 5' of a private or public driveway
- within 15' of a fire hydrant
- within 20' of crosswalk or intersection
- within 30' of any traffic control device - including all stop signs
- where yellow or red curb markings prohibit parking

HIGH STREET STORMWATER IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

The High Street Stormwater Improvement project is underway! This project entails installing new storm drain along High Street between 5th Ave. and 4th Ave., and will continue down 4th Ave. from High Street to Main Street. Also included is the construction of a new concrete sidewalk along High Street, between 5th Ave. and 4th Ave.

Traffic Impacts

The eastbound lane of High Street between 5th and 4th Ave. and southbound lane of 4th Ave. between High Street and Main street will be closed until the end of November. On-street parking on the south side of High Street and west side of 4th Ave. in these areas will not be available during this project. Businesses' access will be maintained throughout the project, with day-to-day closures as needed. Pedestrian traffic will be allowed to access the businesses.

Safety First

This project will have open trenches while they install the new storm drain, so please avoid getting close to these areas. As with any construction project, there are safety concerns with equipment and trucks working; please give them space to work and do not impede their work space for your safety.
