HELP US HELP YOU!

Returning a lost pet to its owner is so easy when they are wearing their current Town of Lyons Dog License and an Identification tag. Get your dogs licensed now during discount dog days.

The Town of Lyons will be offering discounts on dog licenses Monday-Friday from 8am-4:30pm during April at Lyons Town Hall. Annual dog licenses are valid from May 1 to April 30. If you're unable to come into Town Hall during normal business hours, visit

www.townoflyons.com/dog and download the application and place it, along with proof of rabies vaccination and the necessary fees, in the utility drop box in front of Town Hall.

2019 Dog Licensing Cost Information:

1st dog license: \$30.00...but with discount is \$20.00!

2nd and additional dog licenses: \$20.00... but with discount is \$10.00!

Note: The town will need proof of your dog's current rabies vaccination, bring an extra copy for the town to keep.

2022 RESIDENT PARKING PASS

Parking passes for LaVern Johnson and Bohn Park are available to residents of the Town of Lyons (**utility billing customers only**). One free resident parking pass per household, a second pass may be obtained for \$40, and the third is \$50. Golf carts are considered vehicles. Non-residents may purchase a season parking pass for a flat rate of \$80 per vehicle.

The parking fee for 2022 is currently set at \$2 per hour on weekdays and off-season weekends, and \$3 per hour on peak-season weekends. Parking fees can be paid at the kiosks located throughout the parks, placing the receipt on the windshield. Parking fees are enforced. 

CAPITAL PROJECTS & IMPROVEMENTS

The Safe Route to School 4th Ave Pedestrian Bridge and Trail has begun mobilization and construction. The area near the St Vrain Creek, as well as near Park St, Evans St and 4th Ave will have the most work in the coming months. Construction of a new sidewalk and ADA ramps on the west side of 4th Ave. from Evans St. to Railroad Ave. has begun. The project is funded with \$1M in Federal/State Funds to date.

Black Bear Hole and 2nd Ave Trailhead Improvements are also mobilizing to begin work to improve access and parking and adding a public restroom facility. This project is funded with \$282K from lottery dollars through Great Outdoors Colorado. The project will require the closing of the pedestrian bridge in order to replace the boards of the bridge.



EMERGENCY WARNING SIRENS TESTING

Boulder County will begin testing of the countywide emergency sirens in April. The audible siren tests take place on the first Monday of each month, from April through September and occur twice on each testing day, at 10 a.m. and 7 p.m.

Siren tests ensure that all systems and procedures are working properly during the season of peak flood and fire danger. Should Boulder County experience severe weather during one of the planned audible tests, the siren tests for that day may be cancelled.
