This drop-off service is for residents with property located within the Lyons Fire Protection District boundary, for one day only, Saturday, November 5, from 9 am - Noon at the Lyons Public Works Facility.

LOCATION: 4687 Ute Hwy, in front of Town's public works facility, (east of the tiny house builder)

Branches and limbs ONLY
NO yard waste, roots, grass, pine needles, pine cones, tree stumps, flood debris, dirt, rocks, construction materials, lumber or trash accepted.

Self- service, you unload your vehicle
Residential use only
No commercial drop-off accepted
Volunteers will ensure materials meet the requirements

BE A GOOD NEIGHBOR

With winter upon us, remember commercial and residential sidewalks are required to be cleared within 24 hours after a snowstorm.

FALL CLEAN UP TIPS

As the leaves begin to fall, remember to be a courteous neighbor and remove leaves from your property. Please do not blow or rake leaves into the streets. This can clog street drains, which compromises the Town's stormwater system.

Mulch your leaves. Add a layer of leaves to your garden beds to add protection from the cold, wet weather and you'll have healthier plants in the springtime.



LOW-INCOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

The Low-income Energy Assistance Program (LEAP) helps people pay their home heating bills in the winter months.

The LEAP program operates November 1 through April 30. Income limits have increased this year to open the program up to more Coloradans.

CURBSIDE LIMB COLLECTION RETURNS

November 14 & 15

The Town of Lyons has contracted with Baer Forestry to do an additional limb pick up for residential properties that are less than one acre, on Monday, November 14 and Tuesday, November 15.

Guidelines

- Branches and limbs ONLY. No grass, weeds, loose yard waste, or compost. It will not be picked up.
- No construction debris or treated lumber. No nails or wire in limbs. It will not be picked up.
- Limbs and branches should be placed curbside by 7:00 am on Monday, November 14 in order to be picked up.
- Limbs should be cut as straight as possible. Limbs must be less than 6" diameter and all cuts facing the same direction.
- Place limbs into stacks. Limbs should be placed off the sidewalk. Please work to ensure that no obstacles interfere with the pickup of the limb pile by the loader and chipper. Do not park in front of your limb pile. Municipal code prohibits placing items in the street.
- Limbs will not be collected in alleys. Even if your trash/recycling collection occurs in an alley, you must place limbs curbside in front of your property for pick-up.
- Residential properties only that are less than one acre.
