LAVERN M. JOHNSON PARK ICE RINK

During the winter months, the enclosed grassy area in the western corner of LaVern M. Johnson Park is transformed into a community ice rink. BUT, the rink is completely reliant on **weather**, as the Town does not have a chiller to control ice conditions. While the Parks and Public Works team works hard to prepare and maintain the rink, consistent ice conditions can be challenging due to our continued warm temperatures. As long as the temperatures stay cold enough for ice, the rink will be open.

Ice Skate Rentals

Ice skate rentals will be available at the LaVern M. Johnson Park Concession Stand on Saturdays from noon to 4 p.m. and Sundays, from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m., when the rink is open.

To Return: Skate rental returns may be placed in the ice skate drop box located outside the concession stand, or dropped off with the park host.

Skate Rental Prices

1-Day Rental (return by end of same day):
Lyons residents: \$3 | Non-residents: \$5

1-Week Rental (return by end of same day the following week):
Lyons Residents: \$10 | Non-residents: \$20

Cash or check only for skate rentals. Users may also bring their own skates.

TRANSPORTATION SERVICES

Boulder County continues to work with RTD and the Town of Lyons regarding 2023 public transportation services.

The Lyons Flyer is a FREE public transportation option that has daily service to/from Boulder, Mon - Friday. The schedule is posted on the town's website, with two southbound routes in the morning and two northbound routes in the late afternoon/evening. The zTrip Voucher Program, as well as the EcoPass program, also continue in 2023.

As part of the transportation program, Lyons EcoPass provides residents with free use of any RTD bus and light rail services for a year. This includes buses to the airport, and buses and light rail in and around Boulder, Longmont, and Denver.

BROADWAY (US-36) IMPROVEMENTS

This project will kick off this winter to improve Broadway, build a multimodal pathway along the southern edge of Broadway, connect CO-7/5th Ave in Lyons on the western end of downtown Lyons to the St Vrain trail network and Black Bear Hole at the eastern edge of town. Access to businesses will also be improved by creating pedestrian walkways and activity, safer cycling lanes and additional parking, very similar to the Main St parking and improvements made over a decade ago.

SNOW RESPONSE PLAN

As a reminder, State Highways are maintained and plowed by CDOT as weather dictates. Routes maintained by the town are: **Primary Routes** - arterial streets with access to important locations such as Town Hall, business district or schools are plowed with 2" or more. There are also 5 hills in town which have a tendency to become difficult to pass and they are treated along with primary routes. **Secondary Routes** - residential streets with average or low traffic are plowed with 4" or more. **Alleyways** are plowed when there is 6" or more of snow. 2023 RESIDENT PARKING PASS

The annual parking pass for parks in Lyons, including LaVern Johnson and Bohn Park are now available to residents of Lyons (utility billing customers only). One resident parking pass per household, is free to residents (within town limits) a second pass may be obtained for \$40, and three or more are \$55 each. Please note that golf carts are considered vehicles and the one free parking pass may be used for a golf cart.

Non-residents may purchase a season parking pass for a flat rate of \$80 per vehicle. The parking fee for 2023 remains at \$2 per hour on weekdays and off-season weekends, and \$3 per hour on peak-season weekends. Hourly parking fees can be paid at the kiosks located throughout the parks, with the receipt placed on the windshield. Parking fees are enforced daily. Sign up for a 2023 resident parking pass:
