HELP US HELP YOU!

The Town of Lyons wants to remind all dog owners of the municipal codes and regulations for dog license and leash requirements. Per the Lyons Municipal Code, LMC 7-6-20, all residents living in the Town **must** obtain a dog license. It is essential for identifying lost dogs, vaccination verifications, funding dog programs and resources, and allowing for peace of mind in the community. Get your dogs licensed now during discount dog days.

The Town of Lyons offers discounts on dog licenses Monday-Friday from 8am-4:30pm during April. If you're unable to come into Town Hall during normal business hours, visit www.townoflyons.com/dog and download the application and place it, along with proof of rabies vaccination and the necessary fees, in the utility drop box in front of Town Hall.

Dog Licensing Cost Information:

1st dog license: \$30.00...but with discount is \$20.00

2nd and additional dog licenses: \$20.00... but with discount is \$15.00

Note: The town will need proof of your dog's current rabies vaccination, please bring an extra copy for the town to keep.



DID YOU KNOW?

Vehicles left unattended or unmoved on public property or right of way for longer than seven days must be removed or stored in an enclosed structure (LMC 10-4-70(c)).

2023 RESIDENT PARKING PASS



Parking passes for LaVern Johnson and Bohn Park are available to residents of the Town of Lyons (**utility billing customers only**). One free resident parking pass per household, a second pass may be obtained for \$40, and the third is \$50. Golf cars are considered vehicles. Non-residents may purchase a season parking pass for a flat rate of \$80 per vehicle. The parking fee for 2023 is currently set at \$2 per hour on weekdays and off-season weekends, and \$3 per hour on peak-season weekends. Parking fees can be paid at the kiosks located throughout the parks. Place the receipt on the windshield. Parking fees are enforced daily.

EMERGENCY WARNING TESTING

Boulder County will begin testing of the countywide emergency sirens in April. The audible siren tests take place on the first Monday of each month, from April through September and occur twice on each testing day, at 10 a.m. and 7 p.m.

Siren tests ensure that all systems and procedures are working properly during the season of peak flood and fire danger. Should Boulder County experience severe weather during one of the planned audible tests, the siren tests for that day may be cancelled.

GOLF CAR(T) REGISTRATION

New in 2023 and per Lyons Municipal Code 8-3-10 (b)(4), all Golf Cars (Low Speed Electric Vehicles) shall be registered in Lyons. Town staff has introduced a program for residents to register their golf cars to help ensure the vehicles are safe and have the correct mirrors and signage required. The program is for the safety of drivers as well as residents. In addition, the program shows where golf cars are allowed and prohibited. FIRE HYDRANT FLUSHING

Starting in April, on Wednesday afternoons the Town will begin testing and flushing the fire hydrants and water system valves. Staff will be working their way through Town from East to West averaging 4 or 5 hydrants per afternoon. Public Works expects to work their way through the entire Town before the end of October.

The fire hydrants are opened, increasing the velocity of water moving through the pipes and removing sediments that may affect the water's taste and color. While a loss of water pressure is common, the process doesn't typically interrupt water service.

Cloudy or Discolored Water

Flushing may cause your water to appear cloudy or discolored for a short time. This water is not harmful, though it may stain laundry. It's also safe to use on plants and landscape. If this occurs:

- wait until the nearby flushing is complete
- remove faucet aerators or filters
- run the COLD water for 5-10 minutes (usually the water clears within a few minutes after the flushing is complete)
