2023 RESIDENT PARKING PASS

Parking passes for LaVern Johnson and Bohn Park are available to residents of the Town of Lyons (**utility billing customers only**). One free resident parking pass per household; a second pass may be obtained for \$40. Golf cars are considered vehicles. Non-residents may purchase a season parking pass for a flat rate of \$80 per vehicle. The parking fee for 2023 is currently set at \$2 per hour on weekdays and off-season weekends, and \$3 per hour on peak-season weekends. Parking fees can be paid at the kiosks located throughout the parks. Place the receipt on the windshield. Fees are enforced daily. ROCKY MOUNTAIN NATIONAL PARK TIMED ENTRY SYSTEM

Timed Entry Permit Reservations are required, along with a park pass or entrance fee, to enter Rocky Mountain National Park from May 26 to October 22, 2023.

There are two different access options for timed entry permits in 2023, access with Bear Lake Road (Park Access+) and access without Bear Lake Road (Park Access). For complete details for you or your visitors this summer, visit www.nps.gov/romo/index.htm

WET WIPES ARE NOT FLUSHABLE

Nationwide, more than \$1 billion in damage occurs annually from the flushing of wet wipes. Next year, they will be labeled DO NOT FLUSH. Please do your part and throw them in the trash not the toilet!



FIRE HYDRANT FLUSHING

During the summer, on Wednesday afternoons the Town will be testing and flushing the fire hydrants and water system valves. Staff will be working their way through Town from East to West averaging 4 or 5 hydrants per afternoon. Public Works expects to work their way through the entire Town before the end of October.

The fire hydrants are opened, increasing the velocity of water moving through the pipes and removing sediments that may affect the water's taste and color. While a loss of water pressure is common, the process doesn't typically interrupt water service.

Cloudy or Discolored Water

Flushing may cause your water to appear cloudy or discolored for a short time. This water is not harmful, though it may stain laundry. It's also safe to use on plants and landscape. If this occurs:

- wait until the nearby flushing is complete
- remove faucet aerators or filters
- run the COLD water for 5-10 minutes (usually the water clears within a few minutes after the flushing is complete)

It is illegal to block a sidewalk with your vehicle? Refrain from parking across a sidewalk – you could be preventing someone with a disability, or a child, or anyone from making their way safely through town.



RECYCLING AND COMPOST

The Town of Lyons and Boulder County have partnered to provide residents with a free single-stream Recycling Center on 2nd Ave. For residents who are home compost customers, there have been changes to residential compost collection with Western Disposal beginning this past spring. The updated compost rules are simple! Two categories ONLY:

Food Scraps: Produce, bread, bones, meat, cheese, eggshells, coffee grounds (no coffee filters), etc. REMOVE ALL produce decals, rubber bands, strings, twist-ties, and anything that is NOT food.

Yard & Plant Trimmings: Leaves, twigs, branches, flowers, grass, and yard trimmings.

Place items LOOSE (unbagged) in your home compost cart. That's it!
