DOWNTOWN IS GETTING AN UPGRADE

US-36 Eastbound/Broadway

This project will enhance pedestrian activity and enable pedestrians, cyclists and vehicles to travel more safely along the roadway. It will create pedestrian access on the northern edge to the businesses along Broadway, activating the north side of the road for improved business access, adding approximately 50 on-street parking spaces along the southern and northern edges of Broadway and a multi modal path on the south side.

REMAIN BEAR AWARE DURING HYPERPHAGIA

Black bears in Colorado are entering hyperphagia and will spend up to 20 hours a day trying to eat more than 20,000 calories to fatten up for winter.

As bears start to prepare for hibernation and hunt for food, there might be increased bear activity in Lyons. Keep your trash in the garage or secure it until the morning of your trash pick up. **Do not put it out the night before.**

Locking up trash and other potential food sources from bears is important to prevent them from becoming reliant on these sources for food. Bears become more of a risk when they associate humans with a food source. **Garbage kills bears.**

FLOOD RESILIENCY AS WE REMEMBER 2013

Ten years ago, from Sep. 10 - 15, 2013, more than 18 inches of rain fell causing 500-year flooding. The event was declared a federal disaster. Lyons experienced significant loss of life, \$75 million of infrastructure damage and 20% of the housing in Lyons was damaged or destroyed. This disaster is often referred to by many in Lyons simply as 'the flood'.

Over the last 10 years, our residents, businesses, municipal and county governments, along with State and Federal partners, such as FEMA have worked to recover and build back with stronger resiliency.

Nealy 10 years later, the 2013 natural disaster still elicits strong feelings, thoughts, and reflections. During the flood, our community responded by exemplifying the best of the human spirit through generosity, kindness, and collective action.
