### LYONS MUNICIPAL ELECTION

Registered voters who live within the Town's municipal boundary, will receive a ballot for the April 2, 2024 local municipal election, including electing the Mayor and Trustees. Seven residents confirmed their candidacy to serve as one of the six members of the Board of Trustees. In addition, two residents, both the current Mayor and a former Mayor are on the ballot.

There will also be a ballot measure referring a one half percent sales tax increase to the voters for the April 2, 2024 municipal election.

This will be a **mail ballot only** election. Ballots will be mailed to registered voters beginning the week of March 11th.

## STORMWATER AND MORE

**Colorado Water:** A lot of people depend on it. Colorado is the only state besides Hawaii where water flows out of its borders, but doesn't flow in.

### What can you do?

Use fertilizers and pesticides sparingly and consider their impact in the runoff. Don't discharge soaps, solvents, oil, paints, sand, yard clippings, leaves or other materials into the storm sewer system, roadways or drainage ditches. Pollutants that flow through storm drains and into the storm sewer system go directly into streams and waterways without being treated properly.

## BROADWAY ROAD IMPROVEMENTS

The Town, its contractor, and CDOT thank you for your patience with the Broadway (US-36) road improvements. There are signage, landscaping, paving, and minor items to finalize later this spring. The project was funded by CDOT and federal highway funds for Colorado. This is a regional Transportation Improvement Project which was approved in 2018. Updates include:

1. Narrower vehicle travel lanes to enhance safety
2. Curb extensions to shorten crossing distances for pedestrians at intersections
3. New sidewalk along the north side
4. Multimodal pathway (bike/pedestrian) along the south side of Broadway
5. Addition of public parking spaces along both the northern and southern edges
6. Delivery and service access to businesses along the north side of Broadway
7. Improved bicycle and pedestrian access to downtown, the Library, Sandstone Park, and Black Bear Hole
