ANNUAL PARKING PASS

The 2025 parking pass for parks in Lyons (including Bohn Park and LaVern Johnson Park) is available to residents of Lyons. One parking pass per household is free to residents within town limits, a second pass may be obtained for \$40. Please note that golf cars are considered vehicles and the one free parking pass may be used for a golf car.

Parking fees for 2025 are \$2 per hour on weekdays and off-season weekends, and \$3 per hour on peak-season weekends. Parking fees are enforced daily. Sign up for your 2025 annual resident parking pass online:

BE A GOOD NEIGHBOR!

With winter upon us, remember commercial and residential sidewalks are required to be cleared within 24 hours after a snowstorm.

WINTER ICE BUILD-UP

In Lyons it is not uncommon for daytime temperatures to reach into the upper 30s and 40s following a snowstorm, causing the snow to melt quickly. The snowmelt runs down the gutter along the street until it is collected by a storm drain inlet or catch-basin.

Shaded areas, often north facing, are particularly problematic, as pavement temperatures tend to be about 20 degrees colder than areas exposed to the sun. When snow in the gutter partially melts, then freezes at night in the shadow of trees or structures before reaching a storm drain inlet, icing occurs. The repeated daytime warming and night-time freezing creates the accumulation of ice along the gutter.

Please be mindful of these areas in the winter months.

CONVERSION TO PAPERLESS BILLING

In an effort to reduce billing costs and to move forward with sustainability goals, the Town is converting to paperless billing. **A one-time \$5 credit** will be issued to customers who enroll with paperless billing through March 31, 2025. If you are already enrolled and receive your bill online, thank you! There will not be a retroactive credit.

The move to online billing will take effect April 1, 2025. Effective April 1, 2025 there will be a **\$2 monthly charge** for those customers who do not convert to paperless billing and continue to receive a paper bill. Payment may still be made with check, cash, direct checking account transfers as well as credit & debit cards. The online system also provides the ability to set automatic monthly payments, if desired, as well as access to the monthly billing history of your utility account.
