HYDRANT FLUSHING

The Town will be flushing fire hydrants and water system valves, working their way through town from east to west averaging 4 or 5 hydrants weekly. Fire hydrants are opened, increasing the velocity of water moving through the pipes, removing sediments that affect the water's taste and color.

Cloudy or Discolored Water

Flushing may cause your water to appear cloudy or discolored for a short time. This water is not harmful, though it may stain laundry. It is safe to use on plants and landscape. If this occurs:

- wait until the nearby flushing is complete
- remove faucet aerators or filters
- run the COLD water for 5-10 minutes (usually the water clears within a few minutes)

PARKING PASS

Parking passes for parking at our local parks are available to **residents** of the Town of Lyons. One free resident parking pass per household. Golf cars are considered vehicles. Non-residents may purchase a season parking pass for a flat rate of \$80 per vehicle. Sign up for your 2025 resident parking pass. townoflyons.com/parkingpass

The parking fee for 2025 is \$2 per hour on weekdays and \$3 per hour on peak-season weekends. Parking fees are enforced every day.

WILDFIRE PARTNERS UPDATES

In addition to the Limb Drop Off and Diversion Day events in May, Wildfire Partners and Boulder County is offering a free neighborhood chipping program to all residents within Boulder County, including Town residents. A minimum of five participating neighbors is required to host a community chipping event. The county will provide the chipping services and haul the chips to a partnering donation site. Later this spring, the Town of Lyons will be rolling out a Wildfire Mitigation Grant Program to match the county's \$500 rebate for specific residential mitigation action. The program includes Junk Your Juniper, Fences are Fuses and more. Details from the Town will be announced soon, once Boulder County releases their 2025 program rules.
